

Pursuant to Article 13(1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (OJ EU L 119, p. 1) (hereinafter referred to as the “GDPR”), we hereby inform you that:

1. Data Controller The controller of the data provided by you in connection with your registration for events organized by PAIH S.A. (hereinafter referred to as the “Event”) is the Polish Investment and Trade Agency S.A., with its registered office in Warsaw (address: ul. Krucza 50, 00-025 Warsaw), entered into the Register of Entrepreneurs of the National Court Register by the District Court for the Capital City of Warsaw in Warsaw under KRS No. 0000109815 (hereinafter referred to as the “Controller”). The Controller may be contacted via the contact form available at www.paih.gov.pl or by e-mail at: iod@paih.gov.pl, as well as by traditional mail sent to the Controller’s registered office address indicated above.

2. Data Protection Officer The contact person for all matters relating to personal data protection and your rights is the Data Protection Officer. The Data Protection Officer may be contacted by e-mail at: iod@paih.gov.pl or by traditional mail sent to the Controller’s registered office address indicated above with the note “For the Attention of the Data Protection Officer”.

3. Purposes and Legal Bases for the Processing of Personal Data The Controller processes your personal data for the purpose of:

1) carrying out tasks related to the promotion of the Polish economy in accordance with the Act of 7 July 2017 on the performance of tasks related to the promotion of the Polish economy by the Polish Investment and Trade Agency Joint-Stock Company (consolidated text: Journal of Laws of 2021, item 633, as amended), in particular for responding to submitted inquiries and further handling the matter, pursuant to Article 6(1)(e) GDPR, i.e. where processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest,

2) organizing the Event, including registration for the Event, verification of the list of participants and contacting Event participants as part of organizational activities preceding the Event, as well as providing selected materials after the Event – the legal basis for processing personal data is the legitimate interest of the Controller, consisting in organizing the Event and maintaining contact with Event participants (Article 6(1) (a), (f) GDPR),

3) sending information regarding the marketing of the Controller’s products and services, including information about planned informational and promotional events organized by PAIH S.A., as well as information on support provided by PAIH S.A. to Polish exporters and investors – the legal basis for processing is Article 6(1)(a), (f) GDPR,

4) sending newsletters to the indicated e-mail address where consent has been given – the legal basis for processing is Article 6(1)(f) GDPR,

5) promoting the Controller in social media in connection with the organization and course of the Event – the legal basis for processing is Article 6(1)(f) GDPR and consent under Article 81 of the Act of 4

February 1994 on Copyright and Related Rights – participation in the Event constitutes voluntary consent,

6) preparing statistics and reports and archiving data for the Controller's internal purposes related to the number of Event participants – the legal basis for processing is the necessity of processing for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the Controller. The Controller's legitimate interest is the preparation of statistics and reports (Article 6(1)(f) GDPR),

7) establishing, pursuing or defending against claims related to the organization of the Event – the legal basis for processing personal data is the necessity of processing for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the Controller. In this case, the Controller's legitimate interest is the possibility of establishing, pursuing or defending against claims (Article 6(1)(f) GDPR), 8) fulfilling statutory archival obligations imposed on PAIH – pursuant to Article 6(1)(c) GDPR in conjunction with the provisions of the Act of 14 July 1983 on the National Archival Collection and Archives.

4. Data Recipients Recipients of your personal data may include entities or authorities authorized to receive your data, acting in justified cases and on the basis of generally applicable legal provisions, including state security authorities, police authorities, public prosecutor's offices, and courts. Recipients of your personal data may also include entities entrusted by the Controller with the performance of activities that require the processing of personal data, in particular in the field of e-mail services, hosting, IT services, administrative support, legal services, or advisory services.

5. Data Retention Period Where data processing is carried out for the purpose of pursuing or defending against claims, the data will be processed until the expiry of the limitation period for claims in accordance with generally applicable provisions of Polish law. Where processing is based on the legitimate interest of the Controller, the data will be processed until an objection is raised. Where processing is based on consent, the data will be processed until such consent is withdrawn. The data subject has the right to withdraw consent at any time. Withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out on the basis of consent before its withdrawal. Data will be retained until the expiry of the period for which personal data must be stored under generally applicable provisions of Polish law, in particular in connection with the Act of 14 July 1983 on the National Archival Collection and Archives.

6. Rights of Data Subjects In connection with the processing of personal data, the data subject has the right to access the data, rectify the data, erase the data, restrict the processing of the data, data portability, as well as the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office. These rights apply in the cases and to the extent provided for by generally applicable law, in particular the provisions of the GDPR. Furthermore, data subjects whose personal data is processed on the basis of Article 6(1)(f) GDPR have the right to object to such processing carried out by the Controller, in accordance with Article 21 GDPR.

7. Information on the Requirement/Voluntary Nature of Providing Data Providing your personal data is voluntary; however, it is necessary for the achievement of the purposes specified above.
