Basic data

Lublin is the capital of the Lublin Voivodeship and Lublin County. The location has a population of more than 330,000, ranked in the top ten cities in terms of population.

The establishment of Lublin Airport, the implementation of the ring road project with improved access roads, and the modernization of the city's public transport system have contributed to the improvement of Lublin's investment dynamics. This infrastructure has not only improved the mobility of residents, but has also created favorable conditions for potential investors, which is important for the economy of the region.

Lublin is also an important Academic Centre. The city attracts students through a diverse range of course subjects and initiatives that support academic development, such as scholarships and awards.



Lublin is among the top cities in Poland, in terms of the number of students and is the largest Academic Centre in the eastern part of the country. There are 9 Institutes of Higher Education in the city, including 5 public and 4 private ones: Maria Curie-Skłodowska University, John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin, Lublin University of Technology, University of Life Sciences, the Medical University, Lublin Academy of WSEI, Wincenty Pol Academy of Applied Sciences, the Higher School of Entrepreneurship and Administration and the Academy of Social and Medical Sciences.

The universities, offer a wide range of different degree courses, among them are courses related to Information Technology.

At a time when Poland is strengthening its position as Europe's technological "hub", these are particularly important as they provide graduates with excellent career and job prospects in cutting-edge IT investment projects, which, with increasing frequency in recent years, have been located in Poland.

Lublin IT Upland

Lublin IT Upland (Lubelska Wyżyna IT) is a project aimed at highlighting the potential and creating a favorable environment for the development of the IT sector in Lublin. It currently represents the most dynamically growing industry in the region.

The initiative was established in 2012 after the city prepared a Development Strategy for 2013 -2020. The project involves cooperation between the Public Authorities, Academia, the Business World and NGOs.

These initiative's activities led to Lublin's high 10th position among more than 70 cities in Poland in 2020 in terms of attractiveness for the modern services industry and 9th for high-tech activities in the "Investment Attractiveness of Voivodeships and Subregions of Poland" (IBNGR) ranking.





The maximum level of State Aid for large companies in the region is 50%.



Case study – Billennium

Billennium, a Polish company providing IT solutions and services to Global corporations and Government institutions, has been successfully building its largest branch in Lublin since 2011. The company currently employs more than 400 people in the region and is also very much involved in cooperation with Universities, the City Hall or taking part in social initiatives in the region.

Billennium employs more than 1,600 people on 3 Continents. The bulk of this number is made up of high-class IT specialists, who daily carry out projects in the development and implementation of IT solutions for the company's clients from all over the world.

For years, the Lublin region has not only been an important talent acquisition centre for Billennium, but also a place where the company is willing to engage in many initiatives for the benefit of the local community and academic communities.
