Małopolska Region is located in the central-southern part of the country. In terms of economic development, the region is one of the most diverse regions in Poland. Situated at the crossing point of communication routes between the West (Austria, Germany) and the East (Ukraine), the North (Scandinavian countries) and the South (Slovakia, Hungary), it has exceptional assets and each year attracts 10-12 million tourists, new investments and young people studying at regional universities.

Sectors with huge potential

Małopolska has a high potential for scientific research and higher education - Kraków is the second center for research - development in Poland.

32 higher education institutions and universities, representing 7.1% of all higher education institutions in Poland. Over 180 thousand students and more than 55 thousand graduates per year.

In 2013, over 25 % of entrepreneurs' spendings on innowations were allocated on R&D $(1^{st}$ place in the country).¹

More than 100 research - development centres including Foundry Research Institute, Institute of Forensic Research, Institute of Oil and Gas, Institute of Advanced Manufacturing Technologies. In addition, numerous research and design centres of international companies: ABB, Google, Cisco, CH2M, Teva R&D Centre, Comarch R&D Centre, SYNTHOS R&D Centre, Delphi Technical Centre, Sabre Software Development Centre.

Financial outlays on R & D place the Region on the 2nd position in the country.

Biotechnology & Life Science

The capital of the Małopolska region - Kraków - becomes a powerful centre for the biotechnology industry.

A significant proportion of biology students - 18% of the total number of students in these fields in the country.

Balanced Energy

Małopolska takes a number of actions to implement a comprehensive energy-efficient solution. The graduates of engineering and technology in the field of sustainable energy of the region represent **8% of the graduates** of this type of courses in Poland - **3rd place in the country.**

ICT / BPO / SSC

According to the **Top 100 Outsourcing Destinations Ranking - Global Services and Tholons** ranking, Kraków was among the **9 most attractive cities in the world** for investment in the sector outsourcing - **Kraków takes the 1st place in Europe**.

The capital of Małopolska is home to **more than 120 BPO companies,** including: Capegemini, Shell, Philip Morris, Lufthansa, Amway, UBS, Electrolux, State Street, Heineken, HCL Technologies, Capita Group, EDF, Rolls&Royce, Nokia Siemens Networks, Cathay Pacific.

Małopolska ranks number 1 in Poland in terms of the number of students in the ICT industry - 12% of all ICT-related graduates in Poland. Furthermore, Małopolska is at the second position among the regions with the highest rate of employment in the ICT sector.

2 of the 3 most popular web portals in Poland are based in Kraków - **Onet.pl and Interia.pl.** Kraków is a place of residence of the fastest growing companies in the Polish ICT sector: ComArch, Motorola, IBM, Delphi, CD Project.

Chemical industry

The chemical industry is **an important branch of Małopolska economy.** The chemical plants located in Tarnów, Oświęcim and Alwernia are significant employers in the region and a manufacturers of a strategic role for the Polish economy. As many as **93% of Małopolska companies** operating in the chemical sector **have introduced innovations** in the years 2010-2012.

The largest regional companies in the chemical industry include: Grupa Azoty S.A., Synthos S.A., Alwernia Chemical Plant S.A., Trzebinia Refinery S.A.

Manufacture of basic metals and metal products

This industry has a big impact on the export of the Małopolska region - aluminium and articles of aluminium are among most important export commodities.

The share of Małopolska export in the precious metals and products export is 6.9%.

As many as **75% of Małopolska companies of the sector have introduced innovations** in the years 2010-2012.

Electrical and mechanical engineering

In addition to the large significance for employment in the region, the goods produced by those industries remain the pillars of Małopolska exports.

Electrical machinery and devices and machine vehicles are the most important export products of Małopolska - 5th place in the country.

Share the Małopolska exports in the sector stands at 5.6%.

Creative and leisure industry

The creative sector includes the production, manufacture, exhibiting and sale of goods protected by copyright, as well as cultural activities and tourism.

A high percentage of arts students in the Region - 13.3% of all students in the arts faculties in Poland - studied in Małopolska.

The emerging **Malopolska Creativity and Design Centre** will support the use of high quality industrial design in the economy and promote region as a centre of design and creative industries.

Economic Potential

Małopolska is one of the leading Polish regions in terms of economic development. The region's GDP is **7.4% of the national GDP.** Region takes the **5th position** among Polish voivodeships in terms of contribution to the national GDP*.

Low unemployment rate (06.2017) in Kraków – **3,2 %**, in Małopolska region – **5,8 %**, in Poland – **7,1 %**

Małopolska is rich in natural resources, especially in sandstone, limestone, marl, dolomite, porphyry, melaphyre, diabase, and tuffs deposits as well as clays for construction ceramics. Medicinal and thermal waters are an important element of the resource base of the region.

Over 350 thousand business entities operates in Małopolska, including about 97% in the private sector - 4th place in Poland.




Registered unemployed persons by level of education in fourth quarter of 2015
