Warmińsko-Mazurskie Voivodship is a region located in north-east Poland, with access to the Baltic Sea through the Vistula Lagoon connecting with Gdańsk Bay - Seaport in Elbląg. Traditionally agricultural voivodship, called "the green lungs of Poland", is directed at the development of ecological food production. Timber resources create potential for the development of wood and furniture sector. Higher education intuitions and research and development institutes of the voivodship have highly specialized staff in the areas connected with the specific nature of the region.

The advantages of the voivodship:

- Unique natural environment perfect conditions for development of ecological industry sectors as well as tourism and agri-tourism.
- Human capital qualified staff and the lowest production costs in Poland.
- The highest level of public aid in Poland and attractive investment locations.
- Gate to the EU market and Eastern markets external border of European Union with Russian Federation.
- Developing economy and priority sectors: wood and furniture industry, agri-food production, machines and devices production (including yachts and boats), tourism (including medical and business tourism).

Sectors with huge potential

Smart specializations of Warmińsko-Mazurskie Voivodship according to "The Strategy of Socio-Economic Development of the Warmińsko-Mazurskie Voivodship until 2025":

Water Economy

This specialization is based on the biggest in Poland surface water resources, around which tourism has developed as well as many types of activities which also have big innovative potential. Warmia and Mazury are well known for yachts and boats production as well as services connected with this industry. An important factor of development of this specialization is a strong position of research facilities in the field of food production but it should be supported in the area of cooperation with the producers of machines and devices (technical departments). Development of this specialization meets the needs of environmental protection, the area in which the region wants to achieve international importance.

High quality food

This specialization is based on traditionally strong position of agriculture in the region (one of the highest in Poland productivity ratio). Around food production the Warmia and Mazury region has developed very strong scientific specialization in which it achieves remarkable international success and, at the same time, it is an educational and research background for individual companies and clusters. The specialization is based on agri-food industry and dynamic development of local agriculture and traditional food processing based on regional resources, short supply chains and production of food with designed functions. It meets consumers' needs connected with promoted healthy lifestyle.

Timber and furniture

This specialization is strongly based on the region's traditions in which furniture sector and extensive use of timber have been developing prior to the transformation in 1989. The region has remarkable competences in the area of providing raw materials and semi-finished products but most of all, there are production plants located here which provide final products. An important element of this specialization will be further development of design services and creation of the voivodship's brand.

Economic activity of the population aged 15 and more I Q 2016




