West Pomerania's economy depends on its location - direct access to the Baltic Sea (through the port of Szczecin), and proximity to Germany and the Scandinavian countries. Distance between Szczecin - European seaport and the capital of the province, and Berlin is only 130 km. The region, primarily associated with the shipbuilding industry and agriculture, today develops various sectors of the economy, especially those related to advanced technologies. Region as more and more uses renewable energy sources, which can be observed by increasing the number of wind turbines and thermal power plants.

Services of the Future

- large education potential of the region: strong academic centres 22 universities, technical universities, academies and other tertiary units (Szczecin and Koszalin), almost 70 thous. students and 15 thous. graduated per year representing all the academic sciences, starting from philological faculties, through economical up to technological ones. The town is oriented towards the development of services and modern technologies special educational programs aim to provide the greatest number of employees knowing European languages and specialized in IT.
- Szczecin Science and Technology Park
- IT cluster, grouping 100 local IT companies
- the city of Szczecin in cooperation with KSSSE, besides the government programs and Union funds destined to create Joint Servicing Centres, has enabled a proper technical infrastructure and investors' incentive means by an eventual inclusion of the newly built offices to the zone, which in consequence may open to hirers a way to benefit from tax exemptions within zonal prerogatives and together with PUP has prepared as well an offer granting subsidies to investors organizing professional schooling for unemployed
- proximity of Berlin: the travelers to Szczecin have at their choice 3 international airports (Tegel 1h 40 min, Schoenefeld 2h, Szczecin- Goleniów 40 min) and by the road E28 which at the German side has a junction with A6 motorway and enters directly the network of European motorways
- actual BPO centers: UniCredit Group, Tieto, BLStream, Arvato Services, Stream International, Metro Services, Coloplast Shared Services

Maritime operations and Logistics

- favourable location of the region: the closest to the Atlantic Ocean deep seaport on the Baltic sea; area with huge development potential, including the 60-kilometre Odra river transport corridor adjusted to sea-going ship, connections with the system of motorways in the whole of Western Europe - E65: Scandinavia-Prague and E28: Berlin-Gdańsk-Sankt Petersburg, under construction: – the fast road S3 connecting Scandinavia (ferry connection in Świnoujście) with Southern Europe
- full access to navigable river routes system of the entire Western Europe
- Baltic sea region
- border with Germany
- main distances: Berlin 144 km; Copenhagen 290 km; Wielkopolska 200 km, Silesia - 330 km, Prague - 450 km - for these regions Western Pomerania is the closest deep sea transit base

shipowners: Unity Line, Polska Żegluga Morska, Euroafrica, Polska Żegluga Bałtycka, port in Szczecin owns a duty free zone, unutilized transport infrastructure (including loading berths), concentration of 47% of total transshipment in Poland, seaports Szczecin-Świnoujście - the largest bulk transshipment port on the Baltic Sea constitutes transport base for economies of: Meklemburgia, Brandenburgia, Wielkopolska, Silesia and Lower Silesia, the Czech Republic and Hungary, connection of ports with the river system of Western Europe, execution of programs of expanding bulk and container terminals in Szczecin and Świnoujście:new wharfs and container terminal at Ostrów Grabowski with the area of 55,000 sq.m, Zachodniopomorskie Logistic Center with an access to deep sea wharfs river wharfs, developed road and railway infrastructure

- developed scientific-research base teaching logistics, administration of ports and economy of the transport: Maritime Academy, Westpomeranian Technical University, University of Koszalin
- long traditions related to maritime business and freight

Machinery and metal industry
