


Strategic location

Eastern Poland borders with:

- Russia 212 km
- Lithuania 104 km
- Belarus 418 km
- Ukraine 535 km
- Slovakia 134 km

Since 21 December 2007 Poland's borders with Slovakia and Lithuania have become the internal borders of the Schengen area.



Border crossings

There are 38 active border crossings in Eastern Poland:



16 road border crossings (Gronowo, Bezledy, Gołdap, Kuźnica, Bobrowniki, Białowieża, Połowce, Kukuryki, Terespol, Sławatycze, Dorohusk, Zosin, Hrebenne, Korczowa, Medyka and Krościenko)



14 railway border crossings (Braniewo, Głomno, Skandawa, Kuźnica, Zubki, Siemianówka, Czeremcha, Terespol, Dorohusk, Hrubieszów, Hrebenne, Werchrata, Przemyśl and Krościenko)



5 air border crossings (Szymany k. Szczytna, Świdnik, Rzeszów-Jasionka, Mielec and Kielce)



2 sea border crossings (Elblag and Frombork)



1 river border crossings (Rudawka)



Border traffic



















Cities of Eastern Poland with more than 100 000 inhabitants

- by 2013, the macroregion universities will have completed investment projects worth more than PLN 1.74 billion (26 projects) financed by the European Regional Development Fund
- Lublin among the 8 largest academic centres in Poland








Schools of higher education in Eastern Poland

by type in 2011















Lowest labour costs in the country











Unemployment rate





Economic structure of Eastern Poland



Food sector Eastern Poland – ECOregion

- healthy and natural food, Lublin Region is found to be one of the country's leaders in terms of registered eco-farms "Dolina Ekologicznej Żywności" (Eco Food Valley)
- 32% of Poland's agricultural land is located in Eastern Poland
- best class agricultural land can be found in the Lubelskie Voivodeship
- **well-known brands** in strategic subs-sectors:
 - dairy industry Mlekpol, Mlekowita, Spomlek and Piątnica
 - meat industry Sokołów, Indykpol, Łmeat Łuków and PMB Białystok







Wood and paper and furniture sectors



- harvest focus: hardwood (wood of deciduous trees)
- 4th exporter of furniture worldwide (after China, Italy and Germany)
- paper and cardboard production has maintained an upward trend since 2000









Sector: Non-metallic mineral products

- rich raw material resources:
 - Świętokrzyskie Voivodeship
 - Podkarpackie Voivodeship
 - Lubelskie Voivodeship
- **13%** sector companies with the foreign capital participation











Metal sector

- dominates in the Voivodeships:

 Podkarpackie and Świętokrzyskie (the area of traditional industrial districts)
- the sector is dominated by small and medium enterprises
- **biggest plants:** Celsa Huta Ostrowiec Sp. z o.o in Ostrowiec Świętokrzyski, NSK Bearings Polska SA in Kielce
















Sector: Logistics



- investment asset border location
 - investments in the logistic infrastructure an opportunity for the sector development
 - PLN 36 921 m investment outlays in 2010
- increase in modern warehouse space
 - one of the largest new investments in the warehousing market was implemented in the Podkarpackie Voivodeship in the first half of 2012 (lease contract for 35 000 m2 of warehouses in Chmielów near Tarnobrzeg concluded by Pilkington, glass and glazed unit manufacturer – data of CBRE Poland)
 - development centres: Rzeszów and Dębica














Regional aid map for 2007-2013










Eastern Poland Location of Special Economic Zones
