#### 2nd place in the IT Competitiveness Index

The Index released by Emerging Europe, gives a regional overview of the IT sector, available talent, IT infrastructure, economic impact and current business environment as well as room for potential growth



#### Digital leader in the CEE region

The largest digital economy in Central and Eastern Europe, worth an estimated €44bn in 2021



#### Large talent pool

550,000 specialists ranks Poland fourth in the European Union in terms of access to ICT specialists



#### Potential for the digital economy is growing


By 2023 the Polish digital economy may be worth in total €123bn, which will account for 9% of Poland's forecast GDP



#### The IT market is growing in strength

At the end of 2021, the IT market was an estimated 4.1% of Poland's GDP and is expected to reach 4.5% in 2025

The export of ICT services in 2021 amounted to 14,4% of the total export of services from Poland



In 2021, such global players as Google, Amazon, Microsoft announced further large investments in data centers located in Poland.

With investments of this scale, Poland could become one of the leading data center hubs in the CEE region by 2026.

#### A land of smart people

We have one of the best-educated populations in the EU, with 32.4% of us having a qualification from an institute of higher education, according to the World Population Review.





## Competence in English – no problem!

The majority of Polish programmers boast higher education. In addition, Poles have an excellent command of English (597 points in the English Proficiency Index).

# An environment of development for programmers

Poland has the largest pool of technology talent in Europe, with more than 295,000 programmers.





#### We dive into digital

More than 90% of documents in Poland can already be confirmed with a digital personal signature. Government estimates indicate that by 2026, 9 out of 10 Poles will have an ID card with a digital layer.

#### Recognized as one of the best

Many global technology companies, such as Microsoft, Intel and Google, have invested in Poland, because of the quality of our IT environment. With data centers and R&D facilities, the Polish IT sector continues to grow.

Games are one of Poland's strongest assets. Companies such as CD Projekt and 11 bit studios are proof that Polish companies provide the best experiences for gamers around the world.
